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Consultation on proposed main modifications to the Development Management Policies DPD

The Council's Main Modifications to the Development Management Policies Development Plan Document (DPD) was published for consultation between 17 May 2016 and 29 June 2016. A total of six individuals or organisations made representations. A summary of the representations with the Council's response and recommendations are set out in the Table below:

Further Representations by Environment Agency

The Environment Agency is satisfied with the Main Modifications made by the Council. However, it has taken another opportunity to reiterate previous representations that it thought the Council had not taken into account. These are not related to the Main Modifications. The Council considers the representations to be outside the scope of the Main Modifications and as such are not duly made. Nevertheless, if the Inspector is minded to consider them, they are summarised below with the Council's response and recommendations. It is emphasised that with the exception of the suggestion to use Policy DM6 to minimise fly-tipping, all the representations are taken on board as Additional Modifications or already covered in the Core Strategy. The Council's response follows the same order of the summary of the representations:

Policy DM1: Green Infrastructure Opportunities

Representations

- Reference should be made to undeveloped buffer zones.
- Importance of retaining existing trees should be emphasised.
- Add additional bullet point to read the benefits of the development outweigh the harm to biodiversity.
- SANGs should be referred to with emphasis not being established on Sites of Nature Conservation Importance.
